#### Carrick Knowe pedestrian crossing

Continuing patrols of the crossing has resulted in a number of tickets issued.

<u>Motorbike St Johns road</u> – Reports of a motorbike mounting the pavement. Please phone if this is spotted with as much detail as possible registration plate (if there is one), colour etc. There is a public CCTV camera on St Johns road that could be used to pick up the Motorbike.

<u>Primary schools</u> – Officers continue to support primary schools with bad driving around the schools. Illegal parking (yellow lines etc, remain the remit of the council so if there is ever a chance to lobby for more parking attendants at schools, please do) the police deal with dangerous parking, driving and parking on crossings (white Zig Zags).

Corstorphine primary has both Corstorphine High street and Manse street to contend with. A number of people have reported directly to myself with photographic evidence of persistent offenders this has resulted in home visits with either warning or fines issued. This is often more effective use of time as this can change driver behaviour over the long term as opposed to random high vis patrols where people simply adhere to rules when they see an officer (well most do). Both tactics are useful, but please don't think by not seeing an officer on site we are not trying to tackle the problems. On Manse street it's unfortunate that drivers continue to flout the councils Safer streets scheme, we are working with the school regarding options to nudge drivers into adhering to the rules that keep everyone safe.

#### **Operation Close Pass**

We ran operation close pass on Saughton road north. 15 x drivers were stopped for careless driving around the police cyclists
